What We Achieved

Our Programs

We meet the children as toddlers because we know early childhood education gives children the best start in life. Then we grow with the children following their life journey learning English. The ambition is to follow the kids even as they move away from the welfare homes and into young adulthood.

In 2024/2025 we have the following programs:

Toddlers

Ages: 0-3

Prepare toddlers for preschool through purposeful activities and play that encourage language, social, sensory, and motor skills development.

Primary

Ages: 7-10

Engage with kids to help boost their confidence in English through practical and fun activities focusing on conversation and sentence construction.

Early Years

Ages: 4-6

Support children and their language development through play and engaging activities. Verbal and nonverbal communication are key concepts.

Early Teens

Ages: 11-12

Work with early teenagers to help develop their English skills through creative lessons that focus on reading, writing, and speaking.

In the past year our toddlers have "graduated" and are now part of our Early Years group. This is because they started in pre-school so now they are busy on weekdays. We are happy to follow them as they grow in our evening programs. We also opened up our Early Teens program to grow with the kids who are now already 11 and 12 years old and to honor the wish of 5 dedicated children at Shinmanwong Welfare Center who wanted to learn English.



Inspiring partnerships

We work with inspiring partners to create beautiful memories for the children. These partnerships make it possible for the children to:

- Visit, learn and play at the big international schools in Seoul at Seoul Foreign School British School and Dulwich College
- Get personal gifts for birthday and Christmas thanks to Dulwich parents and teachers
- Meet and interact with our favourite furry teachers from Fur all Dogs
- Give back to others with Korea Legacy




What we envision
